Civics education promotes interdisciplinary, contextual learning, so it needs to be integrated across the curriculum. For example, history class offers opportunities to discuss how the Indian Freedom Struggle led to the growth of Indian Constitutionalism and the underlying ideologies and how the very same institutions of the Republic have changed their role over time from being a Colonial State to a Sovereign Democratic Republic. Mathematics class offers chances to explore voting rates among different segments of the population—and the potential impact on policy when certain populations are disenfranchised. And don't forget media literacy, which helps students make sense of the videos, stories, and news clips with which they are continually bombarded. How is the Nominee Civics Teacher facilitating such an interdisciplinary learning?
